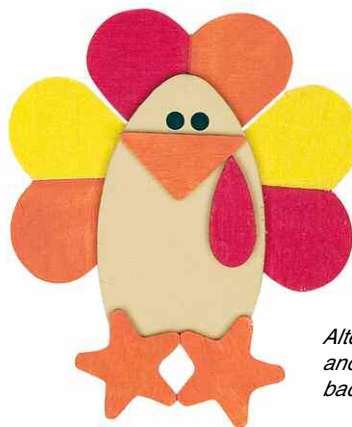

### Additional Supplies:

Permanent black double-ended marker, Thick tacky glue, Pencil, Water container, Paper towel.

*Optional: Pin back, Napkin ring*



*Alternate project: Leave off the name tag and glue a pin back or napkin ring to the back of the turkey!*

## Instructions

Read all instructions before beginning project. Refer to photo for placement.

1. Draw a light pencil line down center of hearts to divide in half. Paint hearts (feathers) half and half as follows:  
*Tangelo Orange - Cadmium Yellow*  
*True Red - Tangelo Orange*  
*Cadmium Yellow - True Red*  
*Tangelo Orange - Triangle (beak) & Stars (feet)*  
*True Red - Teardrop (waddle)*  
*Cashmere Beige - Oval (body)*  
*Lamp Black - Dip end of paintbrush handle, & dot on eyes.*  
*White Wash - Rectangle (place marker)*
2. Glue beak and waddle under eyes on body, and glue feet to bottom. Glue hearts to back of body.
3. Place Marker: Outline with thin tip of marker and write name with bold tip. Glue to front of Turkey.  
**Options:** Leave off name tag and glue pin back to the back of turkey for a fun fall accessory. You can also glue a napkin ring to the back of the turkey to use on your holiday table for years to come.

### Tips:

- If working with a group, prepare a supply kit and palette for each child ahead of time.
- Hold pieces together with clothespins until dry if necessary.
