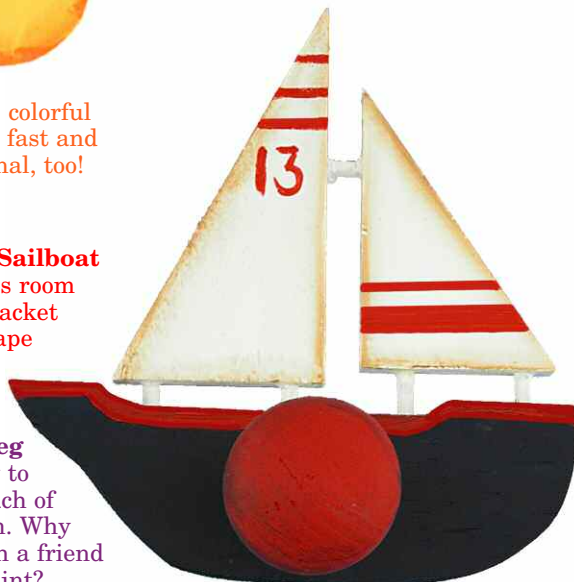

Loew-Cornell® Palette Paper #398
Paper Plate
Paper Towels
Scissors (Flower only)
Fine Tip Marker, Black (Butterfly Only)



Instructions:

Read all instructions before beginning your project. Refer to picture for placement.

Flower Peg

1. Paint the flower and the peg *School Bus Yellow*.
2. Cut a 1 1/2-inch circle of Loew-Cornell compressed sponge.
3. Dip the sponge in water to expand it, then squeeze out the excess moisture.
4. Dip the sponge in *Teddy Bear Tan*, making sure the entire circle has paint.
5. Lightly press the sponge onto the center of the flower. Remove sponge and let paint dry.
6. Rinse out the sponge. Dip the sponge in *Raw Sienna*. Touch the sponge to a paper towel to take off some of the paint, then lightly press the sponge on the flower, directly over the *Teddy Bear Tan* circle. Let dry.
7. Rinse out the sponge. Dip the sponge in *Pure Orange*. Lightly sponge a little *Pure Orange* around the flower center, then edges and sides of the flower petals.
8. Paint the end of the peg *True Red*. Let dry.
9. Paint the head of the ladybug *Pure Black*. Let dry.
10. Paint a straight line down the center of the ladybug's back & use the tip of the brush handle to make *Pure Black* dots on the ladybug. Let dry.
11. Dot eyes with *Ivory White*. Let dry, then add a tiny dot of *Pure Black* to each eye.

Sailboat Peg

1. Paint the sails *Snow White*. Add *Raw Sienna* shading around the edges of the sails.
2. Paint the sailboat and peg hanger *Prussian Blue*.
3. Paint a *True Red* strip along the top edge of the sailboat.
4. Paint the end of the peg *True Red*. Add *Prussian Blue* shading around the edges of the peg end.
5. Paint *True Red* stripes and a favorite number on the sails as shown in the photo.

Tip: Paint the stripes with the round brush.

Butterfly Peg

1. Paint the butterfly wings *Light Fuchsia*.
2. Paint the butterfly body and the peg *Yellow Citron*. Paint the head *Lime Light*.
3. Paint the wing border and inner detail dots *Lavender*. Shade the edges of the *Lavender* with *Red Violet*.
4. Paint the base of the peg *Yellow Citron* and the peg cap *Lavender*.
5. Dot the wings with *Yellow Citron* and *Ivory White*.
6. Shade the body with *Hauser Dark Green*.
7. Paint the antennae *Pure Black*. When dry, add an *Ivory White* highlight.
8. Paint *Pink* cheeks and *Black* eyes on the head. When the eyes are dry, add an *Ivory White* highlight to each. Draw a mouth with the *Black* marker.

Tip: Add dots of paint to the butterfly using the handle end of the paintbrush.
