



# Spooky Cat Jar

**Crafting Time:** 1 Hour plus drying time

**Level:** Easy



*Glowing eyes make this cat a spooky addition to your Halloween décor.*

## Supply List:

### Ball® Glass

- 1 Ball® Quart Regular Jar
- 1 Ball® Regular Band and Dome® Lid

### Loew-Cornell®:

- 4550-1 American Painter Wash Brush

### Palette:

- Black Acrylic Paint

### Additional Supplies:

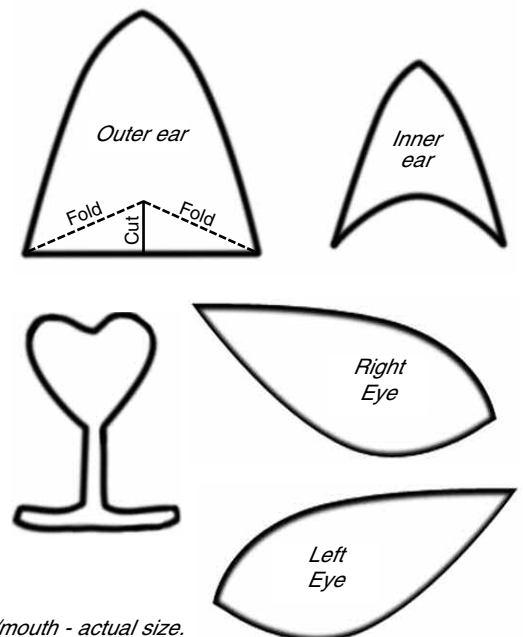
- 2" Wide Masking Tape
- 1 Sheet each - 9"x12" - Pink and Black Stiffened Felt
- 1 Black Pipe Cleaner - cut into 4 equal pieces
- 2 Round Wiggle Eyes - 14mm
- 5/8" wide Purple Ribbon
- 5 Assorted Colored Plastic Jewels
- White Household or Craft Glue
- Battery Operated Candle

## Instructions:

Read all instructions before beginning project. Refer to photo for placement.

1. Turn jar upside down. Cut 2 eyes from masking tape and affix them to jar approximately 2" down from the top (bottom) of jar. Paint jar *Black*. Let dry.
2. **Ears:** Cut two outer ear shapes from stiff black felt. Cut two inner ear shapes from pink felt. Glue pink felt to black. **Nose/Mouth:** Cut from pink felt. **Collar:** Cut 10" ribbon and glue around band of jar lid. Glue jewels to ribbon.
3. Once jar is dry, remove masking tape eyes, and glue wiggle eyes, ears, nose, mouth, and whiskers (black pipe cleaner) into place.
4. Glue battery operated candle to inside of jar lid and fasten band and lid to jar.

**Important Note:** Only a battery operated candle should be used for this project.
