



Super Chacopaper

Item # 393 & 738

Water-erasable transfer paper valuable for all craft and sewing projects.

To use: Chacopaper comes with a thin white protective sheet over it. Before using the paper, remove this sheet. Place chacopaper waxy side down on the surface you wish to transfer the pattern to. Place your pattern on top of the chacopaper and use a stylus or blunt pencil to trace your lines. After completing your project, pattern lines are easily removed using a damp sponge or cloth.

Tips and Hints:

- Trace lightly to keep your lines as light as possible.
- On thick fabrics like sweatshirts it will be hard to bear down hard enough to make marks without tearing the paper. Instead use your stylus as a dotter to make broken lines or use a seamstress' tracer to go over your pattern.
- When not in use, keep your chacopaper away from moisture and out of sunlight.
